Art. 10 Const.

The Italian legal system conforms to generally recognized principles of international law.

The legal status of the foreigner is regulated by the law in accordance with international provisions and treaties.

A foreigner who is denied democratic freedoms guaranteed by the Italian Constitution in his/her country, has the right of asylum in the territory of the Italian Republic, under the conditions determined by the law.

Extradition for political offenses is not allowed.

Art. 10 Constitution - Comment

The Italian republic is open to the international community because:

- It adheres to current international practices shared by all Nations to protect peace, justice, respect for human rights that are recognized and defended in the 2nd Article of our Constitution.
- It welcomes foreigners who are denied inviolable human rights in their own country and guarantees them the right to asylum, which means the right to stay in the Italian territory under the conditions determined by law.
- It doesn't allow the extradition of foreigners for political offenses committed in their own countries against a non democratic regime.
- It allows extradition in case of genocide, as it is a crime against humanity.
