Art. 2 Const.

The Republic recognizes and guarantees the inviolable rights of a person, both as individual and as member of social groups where his/her personality is expressed, and requires the fulfillment of duties regarding political, economic and social solidarity.

Art. 2 Constitution – Comment

The 2nd article contains the personalist, the pluralist and the solidarity principle. The Italian republic recognises and guarantees inviolable human rights not only to Italian citizens, but also to foreigners who are present on the Italian territory without distinction. No one in Italy can be denied these rights, not even by the Government. With the 2nd article, the republic safeguards even the inviolable rights that will arise from our evolving society. According to the pluralist principle, a person is recognized as an individual and as a part of a community, like schools, unions, political parties and any type of association. In these different systems human beings assert their freedom and autonomy, living and developing their personalities, but the Constitution reminds us that a person doesn't only have rights, he/she also has mandatory duties that concern political solidarity (voting), economic solidarity (paying taxes) social solidarity (maintaining children)
